Closure and Reclamation – Imperial’s Norman Wells Facilities, EA2526-01 Jurisdictional Workshop, June 24, 2026

The purpose of this workshop is to assist the Review Board in developing a clear understanding of the regulatory framework that will govern the closure, reclamation, abandonment, remediation, and long-term monitoring of the closure and reclamation of the Norman Wells Facilities.

The workshop will provide an opportunity for regulators, governments, Indigenous governments and organizations, and Imperial Oil to identify and discuss their respective statutory authorities, decision-making responsibilities, and areas of overlapping or complementary jurisdiction.

Specific objectives of this first workshop are to help:

1. **clarify the roles, responsibilities, and authorities** of regulatory agencies, governments, and decision-makers throughout the closure process;
2. **identify opportunities for coordination, information sharing, and regulatory efficiency** while maintaining robust oversight and accountability; and
3. assist the Review Board in **identifying any jurisdictional issues** that may influence the scope, conduct, or outcomes of the environmental assessment.

The above objectives will inform further discussions to:

- identify how environmental assessment recommendations, regulatory approvals, permits, licences, authorizations, and enforcement responsibilities interact over the life of the project
- improve understanding of the relationship between the mandates of the Review Board, the Sahtu Land and Water Board, the Canada Energy Regulator, federal and territorial governments, and Indigenous governments
- understand how closure, reclamation, abandonment, remediation, financial security, long-term monitoring, and post-closure responsibilities are addressed under existing legislation and regulatory frameworks
