- Developer submits revised DAR or DAR Addendums: Early 2025

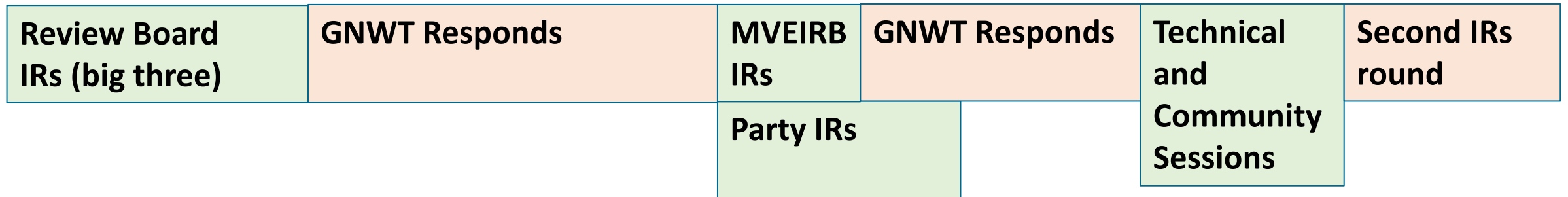
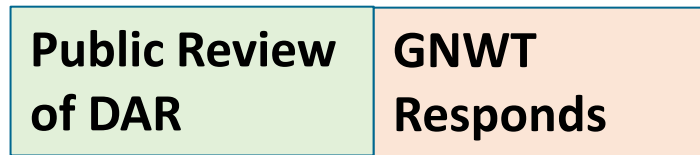


Information Requests

- Must be submitted on the **online review system**
