 - What are the **most important issues** you would focus on if you were on the Review Board?
 - In what ways could the proposed project affect the **environment** (such as water, land, air, wildlife, fish)?
 - In what ways could the proposed project affect **people** (such as traditional harvesting, community structure and relationships, culture, economy, social fabric)?
- Any **Gwich'in Traditional Knowledge** or **land use information** that could help?
- Any **areas of special concern** along the proposed corridor?
- How have your concerns raised previously been addressed?
- Do you have **recommendations or solutions** to reduce impacts?
